Field Trips at Olana!

FAQs:

- Who can attend? Field trip offerings are available for students PreK-12th grade.
- When can I book an on-site field trip or tour? They can be booked year-round, Tuesday-Friday. To book a field trip, <u>click here</u> to fill out an application form or email <u>education@olana.org</u>
- How much will it cost? School tours at Olana are priced per group of 12 reflecting our
 tour capacity and staffing costs. Up to four adult chaperones are provided free of charge;
 any additional chaperones are \$10 per chaperone. Field trips at Olana are FREE for
 schools located in Columbia and Greene Counties and Title 1 Schools in other counties.
- How long are school visits at Olana? School tours including the main house and landscape last 2-hrs. An optional art workshop will add 90 minutes to your visit, including 30 minutes for lunch. Keep in mind, we can always adjust the timeframe of your visit to suit you and your student's needs with advance notice!
- What's included? School tours consist of an Olana Historic House Tour and a guided Landscape Walk in Olana's artists-designed environment. All optional artmaking workshops can be added on for deeper exploration. All components of the visit are FREE for Columbia and Greene County and Title 1 schools.
- Is there a maximum group size? We recommend that groups do not exceed more than 45 students during one day. We can accommodate larger groups by adjusting the timing of your tour or booking over more than one day, If you have questions about group size or are interested in booking a group of more than 45 students, please reach out to our Education Team at education@olana.org.
- What is your cancellation policy for on-site field trips? If your group cancels within 10 days of your scheduled filed trip you will be charged a \$75 fee (this includes cancelations due to weather). However, if Olana cancels your field trip, the fee will not be charged.
- **Should I bring anything?** Students should bring a packed lunch, bottled water, good walking shoes, and outdoor appropriate clothing. During warmer months, sunscreen and bug spray are recommended. Please note, there are no food vendors onsite.
- What happens if it rains or there is inclement weather? Field trips are rain or shine.
 Olana staff may rearrange outdoor components of your experience based on inclement weather, but groups should be prepared for being outside during portions of the visit rain or shine.

Place as Inspiration

Famed "Hudson River School" painter, Frederic Edwin Church and his contemporaries were inspired by the landscape in which they lived – the Hudson Valley. Through analysis of historical documents, hands-on learning about Olana's history and preservation, as well as Church's masterwork and family home, students will explore how they connect to important places in their own lives and communities.

Ideal for upper elementary school, middle school, and high school **Curricular connections**: Social Studies, Civics, English Language Arts, and Art

Add-on Workshop Activity

Poster Design Workshop	Students will explore visual storytelling and civic involvement by learning about posters and ad campaigns launched by citizens and artists to save Olana in the 1960s and later in the early 2000s. Students will then practice these skills by using mixed media to create posters inspired by important places in their own lives.

Nature as Design

Invite your students to explore nature as a source of learning and invention! Students will learn about the history of Olana's environment and the plants and animals that call this land home by considering how 19th century thinkers like Frederic Church used the natural world as inspiration and discovering how nature has inspired inventions we use every day! During the optional addon activity, students will draw from their observations to create something new inspired by nature. During the workshop, students will have the opportunity to work in groups and pitch their ecologically-inspired ideas to classmates.

Nature Creations Workshop	After learning about the history of Olana's land and ecology, students will be challenged to design something new inspired by the natural world. Students will be
	asked to consider key questions around the audience, impact, appearance, and purpose for their nature-inspired invention. After spending time considering these questions, students will have the opportunity to pitch their invention. Students will be provided with materials to sketch out concept plans, illustrate their ideas, and
	nrenare short presentations to share

Sketching as Seeing

Dive into Frederic Church's artistic process and learn how he used pencil sketches and studies to prepare to create final painted canvases. Through hands-on activities and conversations, students will familiarize themselves with Church's outdoor sketching (plein air) techniques and develop a deeper understanding of his own artistic approach. Students will examine the way landscape paintings relate to social, cultural, and environmental questions and concerns.

Adventures in Architecture

Learn more about how global architectural traditions influenced Frederic Church's design of Olana's Main House. Explore Frederic Church's handling of scale, and principles of engineering and design. Through a house and landscape tour, students will examine Church's use of patterns and the how diverse sources of inspiration lead to the Olana's design. Through handson activities and conversations, students will familiarize themselves with the shapes and architectural elements present throughout Church's plans for his historic main house.
